### Filters:

Only material published **from 2015**. This is because in 2015 there was the “migration crisis” in EU, and Social workers faced the problem of integration of migrant in Urban Environment more then before as well as because we want to identify a recent/relevant definition of “inclusive cities”

Screened only the half of hit returns in each database.

Data saturation/lack of relevant articles

### Inclusion/exclusion criteria

Migration has been a “term” that was qualitatively assessed and used as “inclusion criteria”.

<sup>3</sup> The exclusion of the three full reviewed articles was based on the criteria of relevance. In particular, the three studies were not discussing social policies and social work practices in relation to immigrant inclusion. The focus was on urban sustainability transition, smart cities, and low vs. high tech combining urban energy infrastructure with social and urban services infrastructure. The migration focus was then lost into citizens participation and community involvements.
